What a wonderful Spring Term we have had in Reception/Year 1! Our topics this term were 'How have things changed since my parents were little?' and 'Why can't a meerkat live in the North Pole?'. We had lots of fun learning about other countries and how things have changed over time. In Literacy, we read a mixture of fictional and non-fictional texts that have supported our understanding of animals and their habitats and the world. In Numeracy, we have focussed a lot on counting, addition, subtraction, money and shape.

In the Summer Term, the children will be learning more outdoor skills during several Forest School sessions with Mrs Miller. Our topics will be 'What is special about Middlesbrough?' and 'Why can't we live under the sea?'.

Miss Kelly and Mrs Wake's Class

In the Spring Term, our first topic was 'What makes the Earth angry?'. We learned about what volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis are and why they happen. We looked at maps and atlases to find where they were located around the world. We looked at the effects of extreme weather on the environment. In Science we identified different types of rocks and researched palaeontologists.

After the half term, we learned about '**Who** were the Romans?' This was a historybased topic and the children have enjoyed finding out about the Romans and why they invaded Britain. We researched life in Britain before the Romans invaded and what the Romans left behind. We learned about the different Roman gods and enjoyed writing our own Myths and Legends.

We have had an extremely busy Spring Term! All of the children in Year 4 have worked very hard and have made fantastic progress across the curriculum. This term our topics were 'Vikings' and 'Birds'. We learnt about how vicious the Vikings could be and how they attacked and raided England and came here to settle. We enjoyed learning about Viking longships and how they made the Vikings such successful sailors.

In the second half of the term we enjoyed learning about different types of birds, what they eat and why they have feathers. We ended our topic with a fantastic trip to Saltholme Nature Reserve where we were able to further our understanding of birds and view them in their habitat.

In the lead up to Easter we made Easter crafts and prepared for Easter celebrations and our performance by practising our Easter songs - it was lovely to see so many of you there!
