What a fantastic term we have had in Year 1! This term our topic was 'Traditional Tales'. The children have learnt six different traditional tales including 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'The Gingerbread Man'. Within our English lesson, the children have taken part in Talk for Writing, learning all different signs to retell the story, as well as using their imagination with Now Press Play to put themselves in the stories.

The children participated in an exciting Science Week where they all took on the role of 'The Three Little Pigs' and built houses from straw, wood and bricks. We used a fan to see which would be blown down by the 'Big Bad Wolf'! We have also looked at the life cycle of a chick and a frog. The children all tried holding or stroking the chicks and observed frogspawn turning into tadpoles.

This term we have been focussing on 'Measure' in Maths. Looking at how tall the children are compared to other animals and turning themselves into human scales to weigh different objects in the classroom. We have also experienced a session of Forest Schools. The children learnt all of the safety requirements for lighting and being near a fire, and toasted marshmallows - yum!

Next term we will be looking at The Queen and The Royal Family, ready for the Jubilee and then focussing on our favourite author Julia Donaldson.
