We have had a busy, fun and successful term in Year 3. We began the term exploring the question *"Who were the Ancient Egyptians?",* where the children enjoyed learning about the importance of the River Nile, how the pyramids were built and what happened during the mummification process – we especially enjoyed the gory bits! We cracked codes written in hieroglyphs and wrote our own names using the Ancient Egyptian symbols.

During the second half of the term, the children have been investigating the question "Why do so many people choose to go to the Mediterranean for their holiday?". We have explored the climate and how this affects what fruits and vegetables can be grown there and we especially enjoyed tasting lots of Mediterranean foods!
